

This report covers the time from 1 April 2022 - 31 March 2023

2022 was another challenging year of finding solutions to continue to provide musical performance opportunities, musical enrichment workshops and musical support for music practitioners and their students in a time of "post covid re-infection and periods of isolation". The executive members of Music Education Canterbury continued to meet each term and connect, encourage, support and plan ahead for times when being together in large groups was a possibility. Through an uncertain time where the possibility of events being cancelled at the last minute was a reality we were still able to provide some fabulous musical festivals throughout 2022 and into 2023.

The highlights for this time were:

- The annual Strum Strike Blow Festival in August (including over 1000 students from Canterbury playing ukulele, marimba and recorder) featuring guest artists from the CYO percussion group and the HLS song-writers.
- hosting Doug Goodkin from San Francisco in January an incredible Orff practitioner who worked with a group of teachers in the summer break. Doug's expertise and enthusiasm inspired and excited the 18 participants for an exciting music teaching practice for 2023. It was a wonderful chance to collaborate with ONZA, and we also managed to juggle it to avoid clashing with the Kodály course here around that time. Our exec team shone throughout this time with their hosting and we would like to sincerely express our gratitude.
- MEC's support of the Early Childhood show, Primary Schools Junior Jazz Jam, and Youth workshops at the Big Band Festival.

We are starting to look ahead to 2024 when it will be MEC's 50th anniversary!
